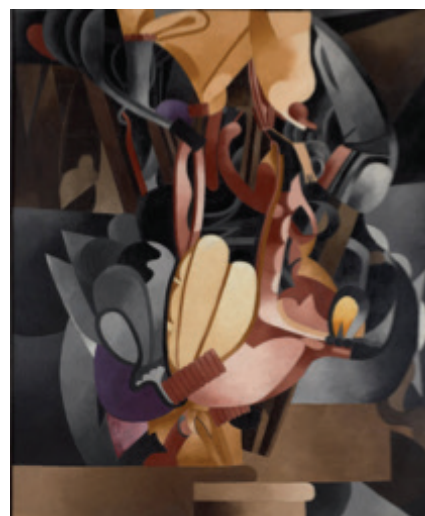

This presentation focuses upon one of the major faculties for understanding artistic production in any culture.

Long seen as a key resource for understanding subjectivity, intellectual prowess and collective belonging, memory has remained a strategic preoccupation of philosophers and poets since the time of classical Greece at least. This presentation explores how an understanding of memory may enrich our understanding of what we think, what we read and, indeed, the production of our everyday selves.

Andrew Hiscock is Professor of Early Modern Literature at Bangor University, Wales and Marie Sklodowska-Curie Research Fellow at IRCL, Université Paul-Valéry Montpellier 3. He has published widely on English and French early modern literature. He is a Fellow of the English Association, Trustee of the Modern Humanities Research Association and English Literature editor of the journal MLR. He is series co-editor of Arden Early Modern Drama Guides and is currently preparing a monograph on Shakespeare and Europe.
